No. Mining /PMMR/CE/2071.-In exercise of the powers conferred by section 15 and section 23-C of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957(Central Act No. 67 of 1957), and all other power enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Punjab is pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Punjab Minor Mineral Rules, 2013 namely:-

RULES

- 1 (1) These rules may be called the Punjab Minor Mineral (Amendment) Rules, 2019.
 - (2) They shall come into force on and with effect from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- In the Punjab Minor Mineral Rules, 2013 (herein referred to as the said rules), in FORM-'L1', clause 8 regarding identification of mines may be substituted as under:-
- 8. Site Visit/Selection of Mining Area:- The concessionaire shall be responsible to identify mines commensurate with concession quantity, out of the mines listed in the Annexure to the Auction Notice, i.e the total extraction quantity of the so selected mines by the concessionaire matches with the concession quantity allotted to him. He shall also obtain consent of the land owner (s), arrange for all infrastructural requirement like a right of way etc. and obtain all clearances before starting the mining operations. When the mining is to be carried out in the river bed, the concessionaire shall intimate it 7 days in advance to the Chief Engineer, Drainage and carry out the operation such that it doesn't affect the flow of river or damage embankments. The concessionaire shall ensure that the sand excavation is carried out strictly in accordance with advice of the Chief Engineer, Drainage in this regard. Subject to other conditions of the contract, keeping in view requirement or for other justifiable reasons, department may amend the mining areas given in the auction notice.
